Living By Your Word Matthew 5:33-37

The Hebrew word for vow = neder = A promise directly to the LORD.

The Hebrew word for oath = shovu'a = A promise to another person on the name of the LORD.

Numbers 30:2 / Exodus 20:7

²¹ If you make a vow to the Lord your God, do not be slow to pay it, for the Lord your God will certainly demand it of you and you will be guilty of sin. ²² But if you refrain from making a vow, you will not be guilty. **Deuteronomy 23:21-22** NIV

Holes in promises lead to holes in relationships.

³³ But I tell you, do not swear an oath at all... ³⁷ All you need to say is simply 'Yes' or 'No'; anything beyond this comes from the evil one. Matthew 5:33/37 NIV

Stop making excuses, and start making efforts.

The integrity of the upright guides them, but the unfaithful are destroyed by their duplicity. **Proverbs 11:3** NIV
